HISTORY SCAVENGER HUNT

Finding information on a historical event is the first skill we will be building with this exercise. You'll be going on mission: a scavenger Hunt of historical facts.

What You need:

- History books / or Computer (Internet access).
- History Scavenger Hunt printout.
- Pen or Pencil .

What you do:

1. Choose an event in history. Try to choose something you haven't studied much before, but also try to be somewhat specific. Instead of choosing the Seerah try for example to limit your search to the beginning (the Meccan period) or a specific battle (Badr for example).
2. Set up a list of questions and try to find answers and make note of the websites or books you have used to find the information.
3. And you're ready to go on a history treasure hunt.
4. Fill the boxes with facts that you have collected or facts you already know about the 6 questions Historians ask: What, who, when, where, why and how?
5. If you find it hard to summarise lengthy articles, try to scan for key words. Scan reading is an important skill for research, it is good you start learning about this skill now.
6. If the scavenger hunt isn't very challenging or too easy for you, add timing and try to beat your previous timing while making sure the information is relevant. Finding information quickly, and easily is an invaluable skill that will help you in the future.
